

Strings Instrumental Music Instructor/s 2022

The position will start in Term 1, 2022

Role description: The role and function of the Strings Instrumental Music Instructor/s at Mumbulla School for Rudolf Steiner Education is to work collaboratively to maintain our strongly established strings program. You will be responsible for delivering engaging and considered individual and group string (violin, viola, cello) music lessons to students from Classes 3-6. In addition, the strings instructor/s will be required to work with a range of ensembles.

The Instrumental Music Instructor/s will be expected to attend selected faculty meetings as required. You will also be expected to collaboratively plan and attend music camps, concerts and festivals as required.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Strings Specialist Instructor/s 2022

- Ability to play violin, viola and/or cello, including a relevant degree or diploma in Music or Music Education.
- Demonstrated experience teaching one or more of these instruments to students, preferably in a school setting.
- Demonstrated ability to work with individual, small group and ensemble groups of students.
- Work as a team, liaising with the Music Teacher, other music tutors, teachers and staff.
- Assess and report on student progress in a timely manner.
- Demonstrated high level interpersonal and communication skills, including the ability to establish strong links with students, families, and the school community.
- A willingness to attend and participate in performing arts events, including out of hours, as required. Experience in the planning and delivery of concerts is an advantage.
- Willingness and ability to learn, to be flexible and to be reflective.
- Current Working with Children Check.
